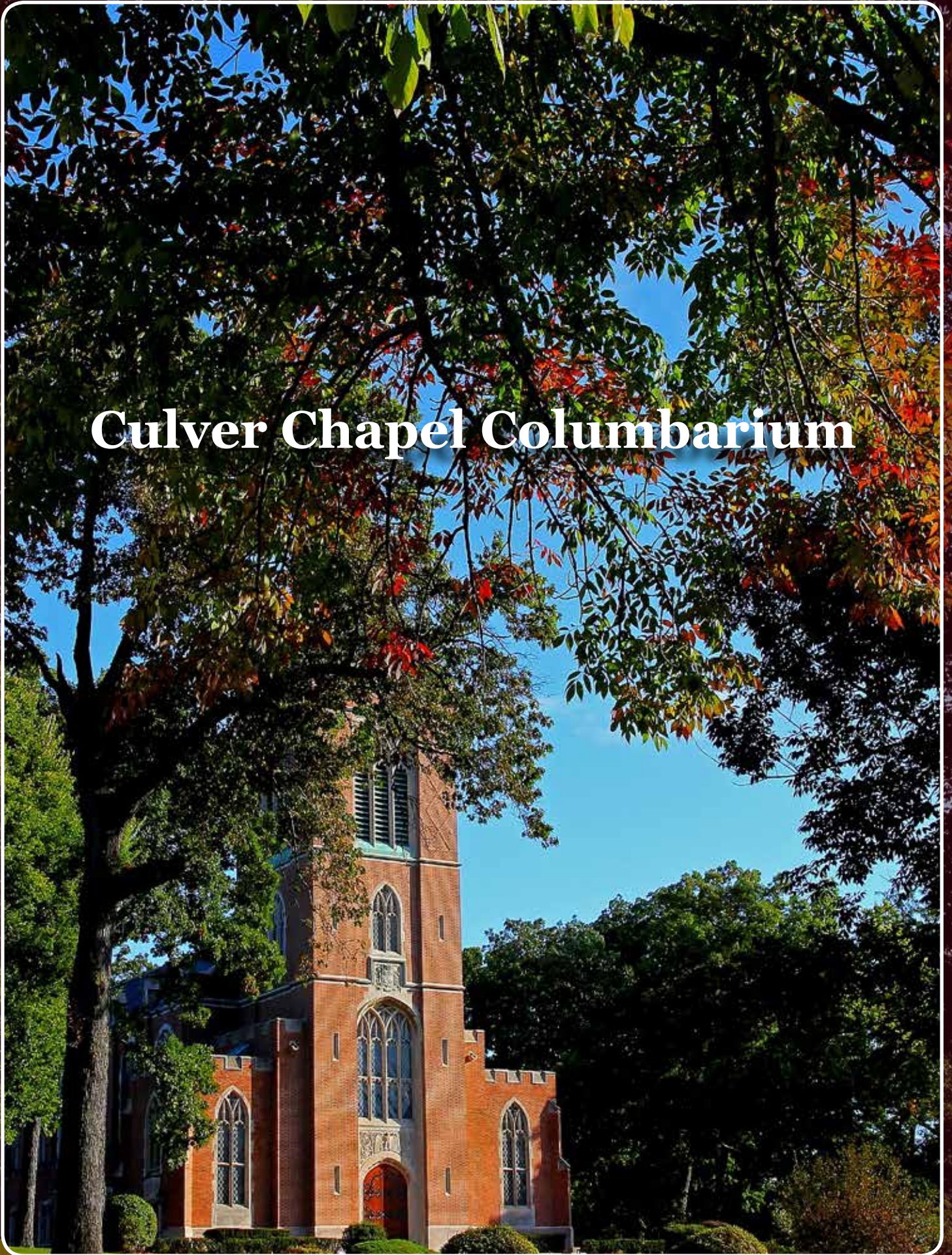


Culver Chapel Columbarium



Culver Chapel Columbarium



One of the most beautiful buildings on Culver's campus is the Memorial Chapel. Dedicated in 1951, the Memorial Chapel was built through the generosity of friends and alumni to honor those men and women of Culver who have given their lives in service of their country. The Tudor-Gothic building opens its doors to the shores of Lake Maxinkuckee and serves as a place of worship, reflection, and celebration for many members of the Culver community.

Located in the northeast corner of the Chapel is a Columbarium with 108 niches. Those who wish to make Culver their final resting place may have their ashes placed in an urn and stored in a niche in the Columbarium. The names of the deceased are engraved on a brass plaque affixed to the niche.

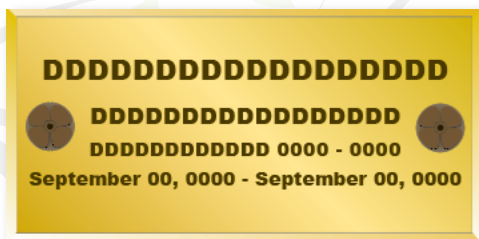
Qualified Purchasers

Inurnment in the Columbarium is open to qualified individuals in good standing with the Culver Educational Foundation and is limited to the qualified purchaser and their spouse:

- Alumni of Culver Academies, Summer Schools & Camps and spouses
- Faculty or Staff with 25 years or more of full time service and spouses
- Present and former Board of Trustees and spouses
- Present and former Heads of Schools and spouses

SIZE & PRICING

A niche may be used for one (1) or two (2) inurnments depending on the purchase agreement. The number of inurnments will be described in the purchase agreement. Niches will accommodate urns which fit into the interior niche dimensions of 12" x 12" x 12". Limited niche space is available. In recognition of their loyal service, faculty and staff with 25 or more years of full time service to Culver are able to purchase burial rights at a discounted rate.
